Funding

Most health insurance plans cover Early Intervention services. The Department of Public Health pays any and all costs that are not covered by third party insurance or Mass Health. Co-payments and deductibles are waived when a child receives any service, including assessment.

Philosophy

The philosophy of Early Intervention (EI) is that parents are their child's best teachers and the most important members of the team. One staff member is assigned as the child's primary service coordinator. Families have access to an entire team, who is aware of the child's development, and continually evaluates progress. All EI team members are trained to transfer skills to one another so that together the whole team can assist in identifying and working on the family's priorities. Team members may include Occupational Therapists, Physical Therapists, Speech/Language Pathologists, Mental Health Counselors, Social Workers, Registered Nurses, Educators and Developmental Specialists. This is called a Transdisciplinary Approach.

Early Intervention provides developmental assessments to the community and services to families with children, birth to 3 years. Children may be typically developing, have a medical diagnosis, or developmentally delayed/at-risk of delay, in one or more of the following areas:

- Motor
- Speech & Language
- Cognition
- Social Emotional
- Adaptive

Towns served include Berkley, Dighton, Lakeville, Middleboro, Raynham, Rehoboth, Seekonk, and Taunton.

Goals

- To partner with the family in understanding their child's specific needs and to provide parents with support and developmental guidelines to facilitate their child's growth and development
- To provide services in a child's and families natural everyday environment

- To support and assist families with the transition to new or continuing programs when their child becomes three years old or achieves developmental goals
- To provide information and resources to families and community agencies
